

## Priority Habitats Inventory – Lowland Meadows (England) - How to submit a candidate grassland site

First check Magic Map <a href="https://magic.defra.gov.uk/">https://magic.defra.gov.uk/</a> Is the field already marked as Lowland Meadow on the inventory? If not then follow instructions below.

## Key supporting information needed for each field parcel submitted:

- A map or sketch showing the field parcel(s) involved and if relevant, the extent of the grassland feature (i.e deduct any non-grassland areas and clearly mark on map)
- A species list for the field
- Frequency of Positive Indicator Species based on 10 random stops and assessing 1 metre square of the grassland at each stop
- A rough estimate of the total wildflower and sedge cover
- Frequency of negative indicators
- Site photographs

## Gathering the species detail:

- Gather plant species data at each of 10 random stops. Plan the walk so that you cover the field evenly eg. W walk. At each stop record all the plants (grasses and wildflowers) you see within the 1 metre square area in front of you. Use the <u>Priority Habitats grassland recording sheet</u> which has columns in which to tick off the species found at each of the 10 stops. Grasses and wildflowers are grouped separately. Make a note, in the relevant part of the form of any negative indicators species you see in the square metre area in front of you, again at each stop.
- When the 10 stops have been completed have a walk round the rest of the field and note any species not already seen. Enter these in the Additional species column. Record as many species as you can whether or not they are positive indicators it all helps to provide a picture of your grassland community and if a case is borderline having a good diversity of all species will help.
- Roughly estimate cover of wildflowers and sedges
- Work out frequencies of species from each stop and enter the number in the Total column at the right-hand side. The **Positive Indicator Species** are highlighted in bold on the recording sheet.
- Candidate inventory fields need
  - 2 positive indicators to be frequent (found at 5 or more stops)
  - 2 occasional (3-4 stops)
- Take photos of the field(s) showing the sward and any interesting populations of wildflowers. Remember to label photos with name, field no. SBI etc.
- Make some comments about other criteria on the PHI guidance notes on our website such as bare ground, weed cover etc.
